## #Proud 2 Be Me | Social Media Campaign

Catherine and Jess presented on the LGBT inclusive social media campaign, led by this year's council's Young Leaders.

Their presentation included a brief overview of Greater Dandenong Council Young Leaders program. Facilitated annually, the program is open to young people aged 16-25 years who live, work or study in CGD. Over 10 weeks, training is provided to build young people's leadership and advocacy skills. Followed by the young leaders developing and implementing community projects which look to address identified youth priorities. This year the group executed two projects, one of which focused on LGBTIQA+ inclusion. The Young Leaders chose to focus on this topic after researching the immense impacts of harassment and discrimination on LGBTIQA+ young people's health and wellbeing. Recognising that there was a lack of culturally appropriate, positive messaging for young people, the Young Leaders designed this campaign to celebrate LGBTIQA+ community members of all backgrounds and identities.

The resulting campaign was **#Proud 2 Be Me**.

The aim of **#Proud 2 Be Me** was to build understanding and inclusion of the LGBTIQA + community by:

- · Educating community members about differences in sexuality and gender
- · Reducing stigma and normalising conversations about LGBT topics
- Shining a light on the many strengths and similarities that we share

A series of capacity building sessions were provided at the start of the program, topics explored included empathy and deep canvasing, which influenced the group's decision to use a strengths-based approach for this project.

Proud 2 Be Me platforms the many strengths and unique qualities of LGBTIQA+ people – educating viewers about diverse sexual and gender identities, while shining a light on the many similarities that we share. The Young Leaders hope to spread the message that there is so much more to a person than their sexuality and gender identity – these characteristics do not define you. Being part of the LGBTIQA+ community is something that should be respected and celebrated.

The campaign was promoted over 4 weeks, across Youth and Family Services Facebook and Instagram accounts, and Council's platforms. At the time of this presentation, the campaign had engaged six thousand + community members.

The Young Leaders also developed a social media toolkit to assist individuals and community organisations to help spread their message, by sharing campaign materials. They encourage users to share the included resources, to help promote LGBTIQA+ inclusion. See weblink to access the campaign and social media toolkit.

They offer Certificates I, II &amp; III in literacy and numeracy including Foundation VCAL for early school leavers (16 years onwards) and adults.</li> <li>Their courses can be self-paced, individualised certificate learning programs that range from an alternative to Year 9 through to preparation for Year 11 and 12.
